

RESOLUTION 375

A RESOLUTION ENACTING AN ORDINANCE IMPLEMENTING RA NO. 8172 OR ASIN LAW AND TO PROVIDE MECHANISMS TO ENSURE ENERGEMENT OF ITS PROVISIONS PROVIDE MECHANISMS TO ENSURE ENFORCEMENT OF ITS PROVISIONS.

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 8172 locally known as "Asin Law" has been passed into law;

WHEREAS, to compliment this Law, Local Government Units are directed to pass an ordinance for its strict implementation;

WHEREAS, the local government in its desire to protect its constituents in their health needs

WHEREFORE, on motion of the Honorable SB Member Manuel A. Chan, duly seconded by the Honorable SB Members Michael L. Cari and Vicente G. Veloso; be it

RESOLVED, as it hereby does RESOLVE, that the following ordinance be, as hereby is adopted to wit:

# MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE NO. 007 S. 2002

AN ORDINANCE IMPLEMENTING RA NO.8172 OR ASIN LAW AND TO PROVIDE MECHANISMS TO ENSURE ENFORCEMENT OF ITS PROVISIONS.

Be it ordained by Sangguniang Bayan of the Municipality of Baybay, Province of Leyte, in session assembled, that:

## Section 1.- Purpose -

- To contribute to the elimination of micronutrient malnutrition in the locality of particularly incline deficiency disorder through the cost-effective measure of particularly iodine deficiency disorder through the cost-effective measure of
- b. To require and register with LGU, Baybay all procedures, manufacturers, and traders to lodize the salt they produce, manufacture, import, trade or distribute.

c. To check and monitor by the LGU, Baybay through Rural Health Doctors and Sanitary Inspectors the quality of food-grade salt being sold in the market in order to ascertain that such salt is properly iodized.

Section 2.- Coverage - This ordinance shall apply to:

- a. All producers, manufacturers, importers and traders of salt for human and animal consumption.
- b. All restaurants, canteens, hotels and caterers and other food establishments where food is being served or sold.
- c. All food manufacturers/processors of food products using salt in their manufacturing processes.
- d. All LGU, other government agencies and non-government agencies.
- e. All government and private hospital and other institutions.

Section 3. - lodized salt to be sold/distributed in the market, whether locally produced or imported shall conform with the standard formulated by the BFAD and DOH.

Section 4. - Failure to comply with the quality specifications and labeling requirements prescribed in the standard shall mean a violation of the provisions on adulteration and misbonding under Section14 & 15 of RA 3720 otherwise known as the Food, Drugs and Cosmetic Act, as amended and relevant provisions of RA 7394 otherwise known as the consumer act of the Philippines.

Section 5. - All manufacturers, distributors, traders of locality produced iodized salt, whether or not engaged in repacking iodized salt from bulk to retail shall register with LGU, Baybay.

Section 6. - Subject to the approval of a Memorandum of Agreement between Bureau of Food & Drugs (BFAD) and the municipality of Baybay represented by the Municipal Mayor the following licenses fees and fines may be retained and used by the LGU exclusively for the effective implementation of RA No. 8172 or ASIN LAW.

- a. For lodized Salt Manufacturer.
  - 1. Filing fee of P50.00 upon submission of complete documentary and technical Member requirements.

  - b. For Importers/Distributor and Traders
    - 1. Filing fee of P50.00 upon submission of complete documentary and technical requirements.
    - 2. Fee for License to Operate (LTO) valid for one (1) year P1,000.00
  - c. Administrative Fine in the amount of not less than P1,000.00 but not more than TOON P. P100,000.00 after notice and hearing for violation of any provisions of RAS 8172 or its implementing rules and regulations. Member

Section 6. - Subject to the approval of a Memorandum of Agreement between Bureau of Food & Drugs (BFAD) and the municipality of Baybay represented by the Municipal Mayor the following licenses fees and fines may be retained and used by the LGU exclusively for the effective implementation of RA No. 8172 or ASIN LAW.

- a. For lodized Salt Manufacturer.
  - 1. Filing fee of P50.00 upon submission of complete documentary and technical requirements.
  - 2. Fee for License to operate (LTO) valid for one (1) year P1,000.00 for large and medium manufacturer P500.00 for shall manufacturer P200.00 for subsistence manufacturer
    - b. For Importers/Distributor and Traders
      - 1. Filing fee of P50.00 upon submission of complete documentary and technical requirements.
      - 2. Fee for License to Operate (LTO) valid for one (1) year P1,000.00
  - c. Administrative Fine in the amount of not less than P1,000.00 but not more than P100,000.00 after notice and hearing for violation of any provisions of RA CON/P. DONAIRE 8172 or its implementing rules and regulations.

    - b. For Importers/Distributor and Traders
      - 1. Filing fee of P50.00 upon submission of complete documentary and technical requirements.
    - 2. Fee for License to Operate (LTO) valid for one (1) year P1,000.00

      c. Administrative Fine in the amount of not less than P1,000.00 but not more than E P100,000.00 after notice and hearing for violation of any provisions of RA 8172 or its implementing rules and regulations.

Section 7. Penalty Clause - Any violations of this ordinance shall be fined of not less than (P1,000.00 not more than P1,500.00 for the first offense and not less than P2,000.00 not more than P2,5000.00 for the second offense and subsequent offenses and revocation of license to operate plus ban of its product in the local market at the discretion of the court.

Section 8. Lead Agency for Effective Implementation of this ordinance shall be the office of the Municipal Mayor, Rural Health Officers and Sanitary Inspectors, Office of the Municipal Treasurer, Office of the Department of Social Welfare Development are hereby directed to ensure widest dissemination and strict implementation of this ordinance.

Section 9. - All other provisions of RA No. 8I72 and its implementing Rules and Regulations are hereby adopted under this ordinance.

Section 10. - Separability clause - If any portion of this ordinance is declared invalid, the remainder shall not be affected by such declaration and shall remain valid and enforceable.

Section 11. Effective - This ordinance shall take effect 15 days after its publication and approval.
