**AN EXECUTIVE ORDER MANDATING ADDITIONAL MEASURES
TO MITIGATE THE SPREAD OF COVID-19 IN THE CITY**

WHEREAS, President of the Republic of the Philippines pursuant to Proclamation No. 929, declared a State of Emergency throughout the Philippines due to the Corona Virus Disease (Covid-19);

WHEREAS, Section 455 (1-vii) of the Local Government Code of the Philippines empowers the Local Chief Executive to carry out such emergency measures as may be necessary during and in the aftermath of man-made and natural disasters and calamities;

WHEREAS, the Office of the City Mayor issued Executive Order No. 55 dated 22 March 2020 and Executive Order No. 55-A, imposing more stringent measures in view of the growing concern over the spread of the Covid-19, in addition to other measures being implemented to prevent and contain the spread of Covid-19;

WHEREAS, the Office of the City Mayor, upon consultation with Inter-Agency Task Force Against Covid-19 in the City of Baybay, has decided to impose additional measures to prevent and/or mitigate the spread of Covid-19 in the city.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, **JOSE CARLOS L. CARI**, City Mayor of Baybay City, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law, do hereby order the following:

1. **ADDITIONAL PROTOCOLS AT CHECKPOINTS** – Non-residents of Baybay City shall be required, before entering the city, to present a Certificate issued by their own local health officer or local chief executive that they are not listed as a Person Under Investigation (PUI) or a Person Under Monitoring (PUM) in their respective localities. Residents of Baybay City shall only be required to present a valid identification card proving his residency when entering checkpoints established in barangays and strategic areas in the city. All persons entering checkpoints shall be required to undergo the usual protocols and measures established to prevent the spread of Covid-19 in the city.

Residents of Baybay City, who wish to travel outside the city, are encouraged to secure a Health Certificate signed by the City Mayor and the City Health Officer stating that such resident is not listed as a PUI or a PUM in the city. This is to prevent problems when entering the territorial jurisdiction of other local government units. As a requirement for the issuance of the Health Certificate, the applicant shall present before the issuing authority a certification form his respective barangay stating that he is not listed as a PUI or PUM in their barangay.

2. **PUMs AND PUIs WHO HAVE FINISHED THE QUARANTINE PERIOD.** – PUMs and PUIs who have finished the mandated period of quarantine shall secure a certification issued by the City Health Officer that they have complied with the quarantine procedures imposed by the city government. Considering the nature of Covid-19, and the danger posed by the disease to the public, PUMs and PUIs who have completed the mandatory 14-day quarantine period are prohibited

from leaving their barangays for an additional period of fourteen (14) days from the time of the completion of their first 14-day quarantine period. The barangay officials and health workers are directed to strictly monitor the movement and whereabouts of the PUIs and PUMs in their own barangays in compliance with this mandate.


3. **STRICT IMPLEMENTATION OF SOCIAL DISTANCING AND WEARING OF FACE MASKS.** – Social Distancing and wearing of face masks shall be implemented in all public areas of the city. No person shall be allowed to travel outside his or her home, or be allowed entry in any establishment, without wearing a face mask, and complying with other protocols imposed to prevent the spread of Covid-19 in the city.

4. **LIQUOR BAN.** – In order not to defeat the objectives of the protocols and measures implemented against the spread of Covid-19, the selling, serving and consumption of liquors, alcoholic beverages, coconut wine, other nature wines, and the like that cause intoxication is hereby temporarily prohibited until the General Community Quarantine in the city is lifted.

5. **REGULATION AGAINST SMOKING IN PUBLIC PLACES.** – The provisions of City Ordinance No. 15, Series of 2017, or the Ordinance Regulating Smoking in Public Places as Health Protection to the General Public in the City of Baybay and Providing Penalties for Violation Thereof, dated 5 June 2017, shall be strictly implemented.

6. **EFFECTIVITY.** Previous executive, orders or provisions thereof, which are inconsistent with this Executive Order, are deemed amended and superseded. This Executive Order shall be effective immediately, and shall remain in force and effect while the Public Health Emergency subsists, unless rendered ineffective in writing by the City Mayor.
